In all the courses of studies research and development programmes are being conducted. After the completion of projects they are published in book form by Prasaranga of our University. Several teachers have been decorated with State and National Level organizations. They are getting financial support from the funding agencies. Several candidates have been awarded M.Phil and Ph.D. degrees in various disciplines.
